#### **ACTIVATION**

- Ask the students why some young people feel shame when asking for help? Discuss whether it makes things easier or harder if the problem they're facing is online
- Have everyone sit in a circle facing one another.
  Read out the quotes from the Quote Sheet and ask students to pick one they can relate to
- Spend timing going around the circle and discussing the different experiences – encouraging them to overcome any feelings of shame

#### **REFLECTION / EXTENSION**

- Remind students that there are people who are there to support them – no matter what
- Have the students think about the people in their support network that they trust to go to for help
- Remind students of the support available to them through school
- Show students how they can access counselling and support services that's confidential, respectful and culturally safe. – display these in the classroom (e.g. Kids Helpline ph: 1800 55 1800 or Online chat; 13YARN ph: 13 92 76)
